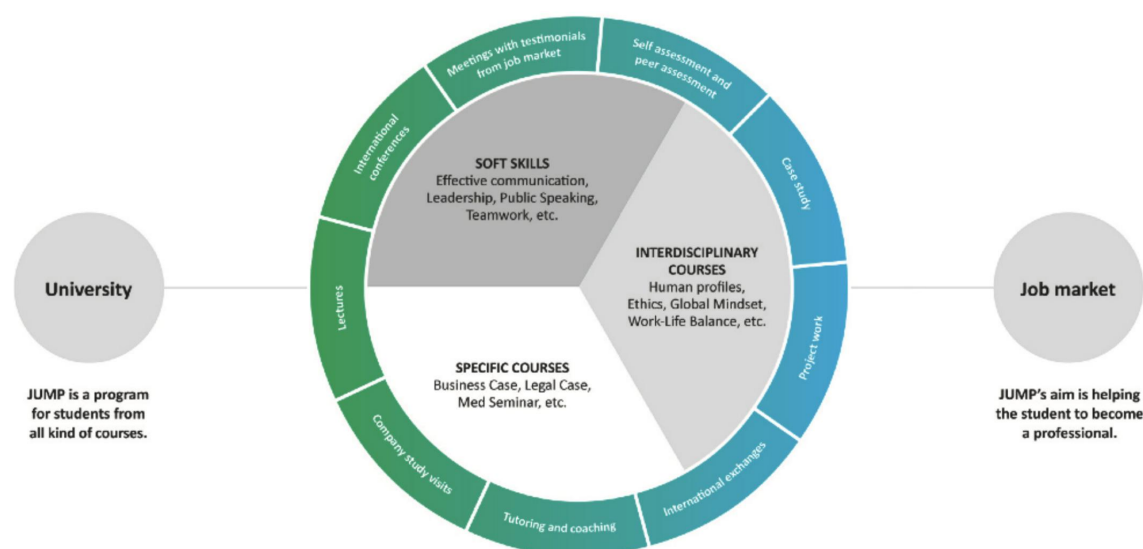

B. Educational project

In the Halls of Residence the learning path is developed through a continuous dialogue that begins with **tutoring** in the first university year, goes further with **coaching** and **placement** guiding towards the job market. This educational model is typical of Rui's Halls of Residence and is designed to fulfill students' needs through **a tailored and flexible program for competences' development**.

The program **JUMP Job-University Matching Project** (jump.rui.it) is a modular learning path including: **soft skills development, interdisciplinary courses, professional activities targeted to specific study fields** aiming at developing the competences requested by the job market. Thanks to international agreements, the program is developed in a multicultural environment.



2. Entrance requirements

All **Italian and international students** can enter Rui's Halls if they are enrolling for the academic year 2022/23 in every kind of University or Higher Education Institution and if:

- they passed the secondary school-leaving examination;
- they can provide documents about the attended university course with exams' list, grades and credits;
- they can provide the final qualification for first/second cycle university course;
- they have filled in the application form and passed the admission test, as indicated in the following point 3 of this call.

3. Application

The admission process has the following phases:

- A. filling in the on-line application form on MyCollege (mycollege.fondazionerui.it);
- B. admission test at the chosen Hall (or on-line, because of the Covid-19 emergency);
- C. confirming the place;
- D. signing the contract.



A. On-line application

The on-line application for Rui's Halls of Residence must be completed after signing up on **MyCollege platform** (mycollege.fondazionerui.it). The application form has different sessions; it is mandatory to complete the entire form with **personal data and curricular information**, uploading the following documents:

- students who are enrolling in the first university year:
 - curriculum vitae;
 - school reports of the last three years of secondary school;
 - certificate of secondary school-leaving examination (if the application form is filled in before the examination, you can upload the certificate later); you should demonstrate to have been attending a secondary school for at least 12 years;
 - other certification about extra curricular activities (facultative);
- students who are attending a university course:
 - curriculum vitae;
 - the final qualification for first cycle university course (if applicable) or in alternative a certificate proving the completion of one or two years of academic studies or post secondary qualification;
 - a certificate with the planned exams and the passed exams with grades and credits;
 - other certification about extra curricular activities (facultative).

To be admitted to the admission test it is mandatory to fill in the **questionnaire** as well: through it the candidate presents himself/herself to the board of directors of the Hall of Residence. Uploading a video self presentation is available too.

Every other document (language knowledge, sport, volunteering certifications, motivational letter, etc.) will be examined to integrate and support the application.

The board of directors will examine the application and will admit or not the candidate to the following step, the admission test. So, the candidate must wait for a confirmation by email before going to the Hall of Residence for the admission test on the expected day.

B. Admission test

The admission test consists of interviews and presentations of the hall of residence's educational program, to understand the candidate's motivation in participating and playing an active role in the Hall's life. In some halls of residence tests, group dynamics and written exams are previewed. The admission test for international students can be done by videoconference as well. It's recommended to book as soon as possible the admission test, to have more admission opportunities.

The admission process is merit based but depends on the availability of places as well. The result of the admission test is communicated by email. The result of the admission test is based on the following items: academic merit, accuracy and completeness of the application form, acceptance of the educational agreement, soft skills.

C. Confirming the place

A deposit of Euros 1.000,00 is needed to confirm the place in the Hall of Residence after passing the admission test and the related communication. The deposit should be paid by the deadline indicated in the email received after the admission test. If the candidate doesn't pay the deposit by the deadline, the place will be given to another student.

D. Signing the contract

The stay of admitted students in a Hall of Residence is regulated by a contract. The following data are needed to complete the contract:

- resident personal data;
- a guarantor personal data (i.e. mother, father etc.).

These data should be filled in on [MyCollege](#). The contract must be signed to complete the admission process; it is valid for one academic year and must be renovated each following year.

4. Fees and financial aids

The Hall of Residence fee covers one year (from September 1st to July 31st) except some specific situations, i.e. the Erasmus students who stay for a shorter time. The annual fee depends on the services provided by each Hall of Residence, as described at www.rui.it.

Special rates are available for all international students: annual fees, balanced to the real months of stay, are **reduced up to 60%**, depending on geographical origin of the international students and the living cost of the destination.

(*) Torriana offers two types of accommodation: the apartments (single or double room) with two meals per week or the main building (single room only) with full board and laundry.

(**) To facilitate the integration of international students, we offer them double/triple rooms within the Halls that have different room types; if the student prefers a single room, there is an extra to be paid: 1.000€/year at Castelbarco, MilanoAccademia, Torriana; 1.200€/year at Torleone. At Celimontano and RUI, if the student prefers a single room with a private bathroom there is an extra to be paid: 500€/year at Celimontano, 1.000€/year at RUI.

International students can apply for **further financial aids according to their family income** and for **merit based scholarships**, as described below.

C. Your free year

D. GRANTalento

Among the admitted students in each of our halls, the most talented ones can apply for a further discount up to 1.000€ on the annual fee.

E. Other aids

Two or more siblings, who are all admitted in our halls, can apply for a further 1.000€ discount each.

5. Safe residences even in times of COVID-19 emergency

Rui Foundation has worked in collaboration with the management and the people in charge of services in our residences to **implement every safety regulation** and maintain as calm an environment as possible in such peculiar times.

Our residences have always remained open and **kept offering their services** to our students, **respecting every measure to contain the risks of contagion, as dictated by the**

DPCMs from the Presidente del Consiglio and by each region. The Foundation instituted a Risk Committee composed of professionals in the field and constantly evaluated the health and safety regulations to decide on actions to take.

The **health and safety regulations** for work areas have been defined and updated with the changing situation of the epidemic to protect our staff. Special health and safety regulations were put in place to minimize risks in order to protect our residents.

The Risk Committee at Rui Foundation has created a **protocol** to be implemented in all the residences with every regulation to contain and manage risks connected to the Covid-19 virus in order to protect our residents and staff. Following this protocol, **each residence created their own Covid regulations**, which is an integral part of the residence contract.

Our residences are, therefore, **strictly monitored areas** where all regulations and procedures are aimed at ensuring a serene and peaceful cohabitation among university students. Some of the procedures are:

- **sanitization of all areas**, distribution of sanitizing gel, masks for personal use and cleaning products for sanitizing;
- new rules to regulate access to the residences and rules of conduct in shared areas (study rooms, dining rooms, gyms, common rooms, etc.);
- additional educational offerings through **on-line initiatives**;
- **limiting access of outsiders** without authorization and verification protocols to gain access.

Rui Foundation will update these protocols as the situation evolves in each region, following the directives from the authorities, from the regional ordinances and based on a precise assessment of the progress of the pandemic.

In this way, the residences of Rui Foundation will continue to be a **reference point** for their students, a place where they **can safely and prudently pursue their social life**, cultural exchanges, and university education, which remains an "experience to live fully," adjusting and reinventing it as we go.
